

Prison Reading Groups Family Days Report 2017

2017 figures

23 Family Days 1300+ books sent to 20 prisons for 750 children

Plans for 2018:

In 2018 we will support 45 Family Days, sending 1600 books and 1200 bags to 40 prisons around the UK.



Prison Family Days are an opportunity for parents to spend time with their children and partners. The importance of family contact for both prisoners and their families is well-recognised and family days occur on a regular basis, incorporating activities and games alongside valuable one-on-one time.

Prison Reading Groups (PRG) and our parent charity Give a Book support these days by sending a book bag for each child visiting a parent in prison. PRG also arranges for a volunteer to help on the day, giving out books and encouraging family reading activities.

Where possible, parents and children read and explore together. Both the book and the book bag are tangible reminders of a good day spent as a family.



Each child visiting on a Family Day is given a book with a Give a Book bag, notepad, pencil or crayons.

We also send a bookplate to be stuck inside each book so it becomes a personal gift from parent to child.



Most importantly, the books! We send new books, carefully chosen with the help of children's bookshops, publishers and specialist volunteers to get a selection of engaging, accessible and varied books.

The children at Family Days range from under a year to 17 years old, so sending ageappropriate books is essential. The feedback we receive on a regular basis helps to inform our book choices, and we try to include a mix of classic and modern titles.

Volunteer Involvement

I was struck with how proud one dad was with how well his son was doing at school. All the families were so appreciative and it felt tremendously worthwhile Family Days vary at each prison, but where possible we arrange for a volunteer to attend on the day.

In some prisons where there is a dedicated book corner the volunteer may be located there, on hand to give out the book bags and encourage children and parents to spend time together with the books. In other prisons, the volunteer may circulate among the families, perhaps handing out the book bags, chatting and helping with other organised activities.

PRG works with a contact at each prison to get the relevant information ahead of the day, and to make sure the books get there on time.

Feedback

We gather feedback from each Family Day we support, from children and parents as well as prison staff. This is a great way for us to learn which books are popular, how reading can fit into the Family Day setup, and how to continue improving our support.


Alligator's Mouth
