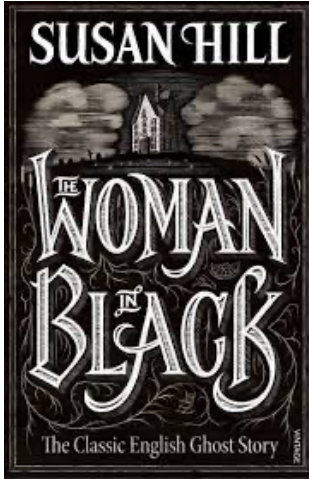


The Woman in Black
