


The Half Life of Valery K

In 1963, former nuclear specialist Valery Kolkanov has served six years of his ten-year sentence in a Siberian gulag. However, one day, Valery's university mentor intervenes and has him transported to the mysterious City 40, where he is expected to serve the remainder of his sentence studying the effects of radiation on local animals. As Valery begins his research, the erroneous data he is provided with and his cryptic colleagues leave him with more questions than solutions: precisely what is being kept from the town's thousands of residents? Why are radiation levels so high? And will he survive the remainder of his sentence if he keeps seeking the truth?

Pulley blends fact with fiction in this gripping historical thriller. It is based on real events of a nuclear research facility in a Soviet city called Ozyorsk in Chelyabinsk, codenamed City 40. It is a Cold War novel filled with mystery, romance, and lots of science.
