


Book Talk

The Invisible Man is the story of a brilliant scientist who makes himself invisible. This new power cuts him off from society and forces him to flee his home and city. Eventually he loses his mind and begins tormenting the residents of a local village.

The Invisible Man has been adapted into multiple films. H.G. Wells is also known for sci-fi stories including **The Time Machine**, **War of the Worlds** and **The Island of Doctor Moreau**.

We recommend this book if you enjoyed *Frankenstein* by Mary Shelley, *Strange Case of Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde* by Robert Louis Stevenson or *The Midwich Cuckoos* by John Wyndham.
