


Book Talk

Spanning five decades, *A Thousand Splendid Suns* examines family, friendship and the role of women in Afghan society through a moving story that includes many kinds of love.

Mariam, the illegitimate daughter of a businessman and his housekeeper, and Laila, the privileged child of liberal parents, both are married to an abusive shoemaker, Rasheed. Afghanistan's volatile politics, including the impacts of Communism and the Taliban's rise to power, form the context of the book.

We recommend this book if you enjoyed *The Book Thief* by Markus Zusak or Hosseini's other bestselling novel, *The Kite Runner*.
