



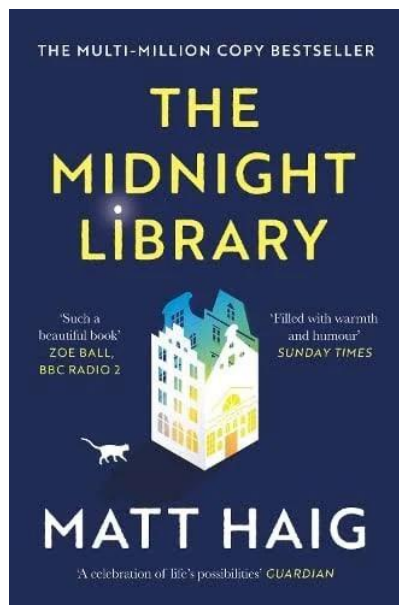

After experiencing the different lives that she could have lived, she needs to choose what will ultimately make her the happiest.
